





## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT/CEO



In 2019, Skowhegan Savings Bank celebrated its 150th Anniversary and what a year it was. We doubled down on our commitment to be the great community asset that Abner Coburn, our former governor and lead founder, had envisioned.

We held customer appreciation events in all of the communities that we serve. It was a pleasure to watch staff and customers interact so warmly together. Our commitment to personalized service and the building of genuine relationships were evident. I want to thank each of you who attended these events.

We ramped up our volunteering efforts by coordinating additional volunteering opportunities for all of our staff and encouraged them to take a workday to do good for others. These projects

ranged from siding the Dexter Municipal Ice Rink's new warming hut, providing clean-up services for LEAP's Stone Soup Garden, to helping those in need with household projects.

We made additional donations, above and beyond our normal annual outlays, in celebration of our big milestone year. Donations to various local nonprofits exceeded \$250,000 for the year. We also contributed an additional \$297,000 to our Skowhegan Savings Charitable Foundation which now has assets of over \$2,200,000 available for it to pursue its mission of improving the economic wellbeing of our citizens.

All of this happened while posting our strongest financial performance to date. We originated over \$100,000,000 in loans during the year, ended with a \$6,761,090 net profit and grew our capital base to an all-time high of \$94,931,966. The bank enters the next decade stronger than ever.

As a mutual bank we are proudly owned by our customers. Instead of sending dividends to distant shareholders, we can make sure the money stays right here in our Maine communities. Rather than making financial decisions to inflate stock values in quarterly results, we can make decisions that are best for our customers and the vitality of the bank in the long run. This form of ownership is truly a great advantage to us.

Finally, I want to thank John Witherspoon for his 13 years of dedicated service to the bank. The results of 2019 are due in large part to his strong leadership of our team over the last decade and the instilment of a customer-first culture.

All of us at Skowhegan Savings thank you for the privilege of serving you and for helping us meet our mission of making our communities better places to live and work.
